### **Project Lily - Gala Evening 2024**

On September 20, 2024, the final Gala Evening of the "Lily" took place at Hotel Mercure/Mövenpick.

In a grand setting, Tilman Friedrich was surprised with the Platinum Lily award for his tireless efforts as chairman of the Board of Trustees.

Tilman Friedrich's volunteer work began in 1986. He himself is a former student of PSK but did not voluntarily join the PSK school association. He borrowed money from his father on the condition that he would not have to repay it if he became and remained a member of the PSK association. Thus, in 1976, Tilman became a member and has remained true to his father's condition ever since. In 1986, Tilman took on the task of serving the board voluntarily.

In a donation agreement between AGDS and PSK, the proceeds were transferred to AGDS, with the agreement that a special fund called the PSK Fund would be established with specific conditions.

A major concern for the board members is that school graduates are no longer interested in the teaching profession and that teachers do not receive the recognition they deserve. Therefore, they consulted with recently retired educator Mr. Dieter Esslinger to turn the idea of honoring teachers into a practical concept. This led to the Lily Project, which formally honors teachers during an annual gala evening.

For over 20 years, the Lily Project achieved its goals. Unfortunately, the time has come to set a new course, which includes this final gala evening. The decision was not easy for the Board of Trustees. For 18 months, we debated and struggled with this decision from meeting to meeting. The original goals of the Lily Project are sadly no longer attainable. The sharp decline in native German-speaking students and the shortage of teachers present new challenges. Promoting the German language in early childhood has suddenly become a priority. New doors are opening. For example, the Kindergarten Network, which focuses intensively on these issues, was formed in close collaboration with AGDS and UNAM.

The AGDS board is already working on these new tasks and will continue to do so. The PSK Fund will thus always fulfill its goals, and PSK will always be part of new developments, all in the spirit of promoting the German language and culture
