

## **DHPS Qualifications and Recognition in Germany**

- **DIA Abitur:** Grants full access to all universities and higher education institutions.
- Realschulabschluss: Grants access to vocational training programmes.

## • Cambridge AS Qualification / IGCSE:

Individual recognition as equivalent to the *Realschulabschluss* is required. Once recognised, it grants access to vocational training.

For recognition, the following subjects are usually required: two languages, mathematics, one natural science, and one social science subject – each with a minimum grade of C. (Source: KMK Recognition Office for Foreign Qualifications)

- Cambridge A-Level (Direct Access to Universities of Applied Sciences Subject-Oriented):
  Requires three GCE Advanced Level (A-Level) subjects and one Advanced Subsidiary (AS-Level) subject. The following must be included:
- One language
- Mathematics or one natural science (biology, chemistry, or physics)

## Subject-specific requirements for different fields of study:

- **Humanities, law, social sciences, economics, arts:** one A-Level subject related to the chosen field of study.
- For economics and social sciences: an additional A-Level in mathematics is required.
- Natural sciences: two A-Level subjects from mathematics, biology, chemistry or physics.
- **Technical and mathematical courses:** A-Level mathematics and one A-Level from chemistry, physics, biology or computer science.
- Medical courses: three A-Level subjects from mathematics, chemistry, physics or biology.

As Economics and Business Studies are not recognised as independent subjects (i.e. they do not count as separate A-Levels), this combination should be avoided when applying to German universities.
